Development of a youth/ family council for JaxHATS	JaxHATS is in the process of identifying parents that would be good balanced leaders for the council. Dental Clinic for individuals with special needs for the Jacksonville area	A committee has been formed to start the process of implementing a dentistry clinic for patients with special needs/developmental disabilities. Currently the UF Tacachale Dental Clinic in Gainesville, FL has been providing dentistry services for thousands of special needs patients in the Gainesville area as well as from Duval and surrounding counties. The clinic is overwhelmed with referrals and limited on service. There are long wait times for appointments and issues with transportation to the clinic.
